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### **Second Convocation Ceremony**

For three year diploma in jewellery design and manufacture technology.

The IIGJ Mumbai was established in 2003 as a project of GJEPC of India and is sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry of the government of India. It has been conducting courses in various subjects related to the jewellery industry. Its three-year diploma course in jewellery design and manufacturing technology was started in June 2004 and the first batch of diploma students graduated last year.

This year the Institute conducted the Convocation Ceremony for the second batch of diploma students at on 12th September 2008 at the Navinchandra Auditorium situated in its own campus. Amongst the dignitaries present were the Chief Guest Mr. Mehul Choksi, Managing Director of Gitanjali Lifestyles, Mr. Vasant Mehta, Chairman of the GJEPC and of the IIGJ Mumbai, Mr. Arun Shah, Mr. Milan Chokshi and Mr. Mayur Maru, the members of the Advisory Board of IIGJ Mumbai and Col. S. K. Arora, the head of the Institute. Also present were the

Representatives of the industry and the parents and relatives of the graduating students.

As a prelude to the ceremony Col. Arora paid a tribute to the founder Chairman of IIGJ Mumbai Mr. Tanvir Kumar Chokshi who passed away on 18th August 2008. Col. Arora elaborated the fatherly role that Mr. Tanvir Kumar played in bringing up this Institute. He was so committed to the Institute till his last day that in spite of his grave illness he had already prepared the convocation address for the passing out diploma graduates. His address was read out during the ceremony by Mr. Vasant Mehta who expressed his great loss of an excellent colleague and a close collaborator in running this Institute.

After the lightening of the ceremonial lamp by the dignitaries and the chanting of shloks by the students the ceremony began with a slide show of 'Glimpz 2008' showcasing the jewellery collection of the graduating students prepared as part of their final semester graduating project. The top three graduating students were then invited to present the reminiscence of their experience of learning and career-building in the Institute.

## **IIJS 2008**

The 25th edition of the India International Jewellery Show (IIJS) was held in August 2008. The show, featuring 795 exhibitors in 1,663 booths spread over 16,000 sq mt, was formally inaugurated by Rio Tinto Diamonds managing director Bill Champion. IIJS had started 25 years ago as a B2C show with 34 participants in 1985. It became a B2B in 2001. IIJS 2008 had seven country pavilions that included those from Italy, Belgium, Thailand, Japan, Dubai, Turkey and Israel, making this a truly global sourcing event. Delegations from Hungary, Uzbekistan, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Thailand, Israel and Iran also visited the show.

Speaking at the inaugural function, GJEPC chairman Sanjay Kothari said India offered opportunities on a scale unprecedented elsewhere. There were three-quarters of a million people in the gem and jewellery export production industry that notched up \$20 billion in exports over fiscal 2007-08 and another 3 million people in the domestic jewellery industry that featured 300,000 showrooms and annual sales that were at least as great as the \$20 billion export figure if not much greater. Much of that domestic industry was in evidence in a surprisingly high visitor turnout from the first day.

Around 17 authoritative seminars had been organized during the five days of IIJS. The Solitaire Awards held at IIJS every year highlights the remarkable talent and innovativeness of India's jewellery designers. A unique theme had been chosen for this year's competition 'The Alluring Seasons Summer, Spring, Monsoon and Winter'. The winning collection, consisting of pieces in both daily and formal wear, was on display during the show. An additional category this year was for design of unconventional ornamentation such as spectacles, mobile phones, hair accessories, etc. There was celebration time each evening due to IIJS completing 25 glorious years. IIGJ had its stall and display of the winning designs and pieces of its Vision 2008. The designs were highly appreciated and this show had been a splendid opportunity for students to display the work and gain first hand experience with direct interaction with the industry.

The global economic slowdown headed by the recession in the US and high inflation in the Indian market that had seen food prices rise at an astounding 30% in a few months. Would anyone be interested in gems and jewellery? The answer, not only by way of visitor footfalls, but also by actual business transacted, was a resounding yes. Visitor footfalls totaled 44, 292 by the end of the show, but more importantly, those visitors were hungry for product. Many exhibitors reported that unlike in other years, when visitors would place orders with lead times of a month or two at least, this year, they wanted almost immediate delivery. "This leads me to believe we won't have a situation like last year, when they placed orders but then went home and cancelled most of them within a few weeks' time. This year, they wanted physical possession of the product as fast as possible," spoke an official observer.

The diamond and gem-set jewellery did particularly well, while plain gold jewellery did not report the same high level of buyer interest. Light-weight gold jewellery, however, did extremely well. Volatile gold prices are to be blamed for the cautious buyer approach to the latter category. Surprisingly, substantial looking jewellery did well, though those designs that were successful had added value through design and did not simply deliver intrinsic value as has traditionally been the case in this category. The Japanese pavilion, on its first outing at IIJS, offering high end jewellery and pink diamonds, reported good business and Atul Parekh, the group's coordinator, reported that participants were happy overall. The Italian pavilion, for its part, reported that the show had been average to good.

Not everyone was happy! Loose diamond sellers from Israel commented that there was a tremendous price resistance from Indian buyers. Some saw movement of their goods only after softening their asking prices. Overall diamond buyers were not willing to firm up prices. In colored gemstones and jewellery, the Thai pavilion too did not think they had achieved their full potential even though they did see a fair amount of business. Show convener Navin Jashnani said he expects this positive trend to carry on well through January next year and the IIJS Signature 2009 show slated for February 20-23. Due to industry pressure, the high end show is set to expand by a highly controlled 20 or 30 booths.

## **IIGJ Vision 2008**

This year, IIGJ VISION 2008 entered in its fourth successful year, with the target aiming at discovering and encouraging fresh talent in jewellery design. IIGJ truly provides a supportive platform to the students and designers. The competition received an overwhelming response from students and professionals from all across the country.

This year the theme of the competition was; Fusion. Entries were called in three categories Casual or day wears, Evening or party wear and Bridal or formal wear. Like every year, this year also the highest numbers of entries were received in the Party wear category, followed by Casual wear and Bridal wear. The dominant category was the neckwear and sets at 50% of all the entries. Participation by the institutes under the GJEPC was about 45%. Noteworthy was the participation by more than 50% design institutes located across India. The highest number of entries were received in Party wear Category (55%), Casual wear (29%) and Bridal wear (16%). More than 90% of the participants were professionals, who presented designs based on inspirations such as global warming, natural elements like melting sun, flowers, day and night etc. Enamellings was used extensively in quite a few pieces. Beautiful designs were submitted for earrings (14%) and wrist-wear (8%).

Armlets and accessories were very few. This year the dominant design entries have been earrings and pendants, rings, though beautiful and inspiring designs have been received as brooches, armlets and belt enhancers.

Winners were selected over three rounds of judging. Judges for all the three rounds comprised of noted jewellery designers, faculty members and people from the industry. For the first round the judges were; Mrs. Janki Choksi (Coordinator, vision 2008), Mrs. Monica Zhaveri (Faculty, JPDC-Mumbai) and Ms. Zarna Tankaria (Faculty, IIGJ-Mumbai).

Eminent judges for round two were Shuchi Pandya (Shankar Jewels), Kunal Shah (KBS Designs) and Mr. Ashay Mehta (Ornamentation). The 18 finalists selected in round 2, proceeded with manufacturing of the designs with the help from their respective sponsors. The judges for round three were Mrs. Binaisha Zhaveri (TBZ- the original), Mr. Vineet Naheta (Jaipur Jewels), Mrs. Namita Shankar Pandya and Ms Meenal Choksi (Moksh). IIGJ thanks all the judges who were the eminent members of the industry, jewellery manufactures, retailers and designers for sparing their valuable time and providing support in selecting the winning designs.

The outstanding jewellery pieces designed by the 18 winners of IIGJ Vision 2008 were on display at the IIGJ booth during the India International Jewellery Show (IIS). Prizes and certificates were awarded to the winners at a fashion show held during IIS 2008. The award winning jewellery would be catalogued and distributed to a wide database of jewellery companies and to Indian and international publications.

## **GJEPC and IIGJ holds seminar by Eddie Bell**

A one-day seminar on the 'Casting Process: 13 Steps to Perfect Casting' was organized by the Gems & Jewellery Export Promotion Council of India (GJEPC) and the IIGJ on 6th August at the Navinchandra Auditorium of the IIGJ Mumbai. It was well-attended by a large gathering of representatives of the various jewellery industries.

The seminar was conducted by Mr. Eddie Bell who is the Technical Director of Rio Grande, one of the largest and most diversified suppliers to the jewellery industry in the world and also the President of Neutec, USA, which is the manufacturer of advanced casting systems for jewellery production. He is the founder of the Santa Fe Symposium on Jewellery Manufacturing Technology now in its 23rd year and edits the published proceedings that are known as the SFS books which are widely referred in the jewellery industry. Eddie Bell gave an overview of the jewellery casting process touching on each of the 13 process steps. Each step was discussed in some detail to bring out its importance and the inter-relationship with other steps. The gathering learnt much and communicated with him as well.

## **GJEPC and IIGJ holds seminar by Dr. Roberto Gudali at IIGJ**

A seminar on the 'Refining- High Recovery Safe Pollution Free Refining' was organized by the GJEPC and the IIGJ on 5th August at the Navinchandra Auditorium of the IIGJ Mumbai. It was attended mainly by the representatives of the jewellery industries who carry out the precious metal refining business.

The seminar was conducted by Dr. Roberto Gudali, the Managing Director of Italmimpianti Orafi, Italy who has thirty years of experience in precious metal refining. He is an expert on the designing of the machinery for the process of refining in a pollution free environment based on the ISO 14064 Standards. The seminar dealt with the various types of material for refining and the methodologies of the stages of the refining process that is pre-refining, refining and post-refining. He also brought out the pros and cons of each of these methods and laid stress on the post-refining treatment of the fumes and the liquid effluents to make the process safe and environment friendly.

## **Director of Ministry of Commerce and Industry visits IIGJ Mumbai.**

Mr. Anurag Saxena, Director of Ministry of Commerce and Industry, New Delhi accompanied by Mr. K.K.Duggal, Regional Director, GJEPC New Delhi visited IIGJ Mumbai on 30th September.

### **IIGJ conducts gold appraisal methods seminar for HDFC Bank officers**

There was a one day seminar held on 15th July for the bank officers of HDFC bank on appraisal methods for gold jewellery.

The seminar was conducted on the request of the HDFC bank as they wanted to structure loans for gold jewellery. The seminar started with Col. S. K. Arora giving the introductory speech. The morning session was utilized by giving an audio visual presentation to explain the intrinsic value of gold. Both international and the Indian market behavior patterns were highlighted. Emphasis was laid on the rise of prices in gold with relation to mining operations worldwide, prices in relation to inflation, dollar and oil prices. People hedging towards gold during times of monetary and political crisis were also emphasized. The next part of the audio visual presentation highlighted the appraisal methods of gold. All the modern techniques were explained along with the age old touch stone technique. Accuracies of all the techniques were discussed.

The afternoon session involved active participation by the HDFC officers with the IIGJ faculty to get the feel of the gold ornaments. The variety of ornaments was provided by the IIGJ management. The use of eye glass (10X) to check the finer point on the jewellery was displayed. Each of the individual got hands on experience of using the eye glass. The colors of different karats of gold were also shown. Finally the use of the touch stone method was demonstrated to the members of HDFC bank.

A final question answer session was held to clear any doubts lingering in their minds. Feedback forms were given individually that were filled and returned to IIGJ. Faculties involved during the course of the seminar were Mr. Umesh G. Chavan, (head of manufacturing department) Mr. Uttamkumar Das and Mr. Vinod Katkar (from manufacturing department). IIGJ is open to such training programmes for the Industry as well as those related to banks, audits etc.

### **Mayor of Mumbai visits IIGJ**

## **Diploma course in jewellery designing and manufacturing Work shop using technology in refining of precious metals for industries**

The faculty members of IIGJ Mr. Umesh G. Chavan, Mr. Vinod Katkar and Mr. S. Mukerjee conducted a workshop using the state of art equipment imported from Italmimpianti Orafi Italy.

The objectives of the workshop were to impart the knowledge of the various refining process, the equipment used for these processes, the benefits of the systematic processing of the wastes generated in the jewellery manufacturing units. SWAT analysis of the refining process. To impart the knowledge of the emerging technologies in refining to the executives.

IIGJ had invited the following companies for participation in the workshop; Diamour, Unidesign, Goldstar, HV jewels, Diatrends, Dimpex, Kiah life styles.

The workshop started with Col. Arora addressing the executives of the companies. The salient features of the workshop were: The various grades of gold dust bought by the company Diamour was processed on the equipment. The crucible dust from the casting was fully processed and the recovery obtained was 98% of the deposited gold in the dust. The processing of the other grades of dusts was also carried out and the results were documented and the pure gold obtained was taken by the company. The entire theory of refining was discussed with the executives of the various companies present there and the ideal processes were discussed in depth.

The recovery of the platinum dust mixed with the gold dust was also discussed. The filing and polishing of the sintered rings in the various departments was also discussed along with the recovery of platinum from the dust generated in this process. The questions were discussed and the solutions were offered during the question answer session. The benefits of refining using this state of the art technology were clear with the 98% recovery rate of pure gold obtained from the casting dust. The methodology used for refining of dust was obtained from sintered gold and platinum ring.

The workshop helped explore the frontiers of knowledge and helped in imparting knowledge to the participating executives and the personnel of the companies. We thank Alpha international for delegating their executive for the smooth conduct of the workshop.

The Dubai Pearl Exchange, a subsidiary of the Dubai Multi Commodities Centre (DMCC), will host the first-ever World Pearl Forum at the Atlantis hotel, Palm Jumeirah from February 17 to 18, 2009. The event aims to bring together the global pearl sector and address ways to grow the worldwide market for pearl jewellery. The inaugural World Pearl Forum will see participation from more than 200 leading pearl specialists from across the world. Senior representatives from pearl producers, national pearl bodies, certification specialists and jewellery trade experts will gather in Dubai to address the opportunities and debate the latest challenges in the global pearl sector.

DMCC executive chairman Ahmed Bin Sulayem said: "The objective behind the first-ever World Pearl Forum is to create a long-term platform for international debate on how to further develop the pearl sector globally, through a cohesive approach to educating consumers and fostering demand for pearls." Confirmed speakers at the event include Robert Wan Tahiti chairman Robert Wan, K. Mikimoto and Co. President Noriyuki Morita and Iridesse (part of Tiffany and Co.) MD Robert Van. Pearls presently represent about 2% of the global jewellery trade and studies show that the pearl trade has significant growth potential, the DMCC said.
